

Environmental Sustainability Policy

Section 1 - Introduction

(1) The University of Newcastle (University) is committed to becoming a leader in environmental sustainability within the University sector. The University regards the implementation of leading environmental sustainability practices as critical to our performance as a world class teaching and research based organisation.

Section 2 - Policy

(2) The University aims to achieve our environmental sustainability goals through the ongoing development and implementation of an endorsed Environmental Sustainability Plan which supports environmental sustainability through ethical decision making in accordance with the [Ethical Framework](#), teaching and learning practices, research, the management of University campus and facilities, and community engagement.

(3) The University will ensure the following principles are embedded across the University:

- a. demonstration of a visible commitment to environmental sustainability by University leaders;
- b. dedication of resources to support the ongoing implementation of environmental sustainability actions and targets in the [Environmental Sustainability Plan](#);
- c. demonstrating continuous improvement towards the achievement of the measures of success of our Environmental Sustainability Plan;
- d. monitoring the implementation of the Environmental Sustainability Plan, and reporting on the University's achievement against our objectives on an annual basis to University Council, Executive Committee and within the University's annual report;
- e. actively promoting and engaging environmental sustainability initiatives to staff and students at the University; and
- f. environmental sustainability actions to contribute to the targets set in the United Nations (UN) Sustainable Development Goals 2015.

Glossary Terms and Definitions

"University" - The University of Newcastle, a body corporate established under sections 4 and 5 of the University of Newcastle Act 1989.

"Campus" - The Callaghan campus (being the land bounded by, but not including, University Drive, Highway Route 123, the main Northern rail line and the Shortland waters golf course); i. the Newcastle CBD campus: a. Hunter Street, Worth Place, Northern rail line and Steel Street; b. being the land bounded by, but not including, Auckland Street, Hunter Street, Darby Street and King Street; c. being the land bounded by, but not including, Auckland Street, Gibson Street, Laman Street and Charles Street; d. being the land bounded by, but not including, King Street, Pacific Street, Ocean Street, Shortland Esplanade, Church Street and Watt Street; ii. the Ourimbah campus (being that part of Ourimbah bounded by, but not including, Chittaway Road, Brush Road and the Northern rail line).

"Student" - A person formally enrolled in a course or active in a program offered by the University or affiliated entity.

"Staff" - Means a person who was at the relevant time employed by the University and includes professional and academic staff of the University, by contract or ongoing, as well as conjoint staff but does not include visitors to the University.
