Schedule to the Awards and Graduation Policy

Section 1 - Faculty of Education and Arts

Transfer of Students

(1) The Bachelor of Education Studies is the exit award for students enrolled in one of the following degree programs:

- a. Bachelor of Teaching (Early Childhood and Primary) (Honours)
- b. Bachelor of Teaching (Primary) (Honours)
- c. Bachelor of Teaching (Humanities) (Honours)
- d. Bachelor of Teaching (Mathematics) (Honours)
- e. Bachelor of Teaching (Science) (Honours)
- f. Bachelor of Teaching (Technology) (Honours)
- g. Bachelor of Teaching (Health and Physical Education) (Honours)
- h. Bachelor of Teaching (Fine Art) (Honours)
- i. Bachelor of Teaching (Primary) / Bachelor of Arts
- j. Bachelor of Teaching (Primary) / Bachelor of Early Childhood Studies
- k. Bachelor of Teaching (Secondary) / Bachelor of Arts
- l. Bachelor of Teaching (Secondary) / Bachelor of Fine Art
- m. Bachelor of Teaching (Secondary) / Bachelor of Health and Physical Education
- n. Bachelor of Teaching (Secondary) / Bachelor of Mathematics
- o. Bachelor of Teaching (Secondary) / Bachelor of Science
- p. Bachelor of Teaching (Secondary) / Bachelor of Technology

(2) Students for one of the degrees programs list in Clause 1 who have satisfied the requirements for the Bachelor of Education Studies may be permitted to transfer to the exit degree Bachelor of Education Studies. Students wishing to transfer shall apply in writing to the Pro Vice-Chancellor, Faculty of Education and Arts, for approval.

Section 2 - Qualification for Bachelor of Education Studies

(3) The Bachelor of Education Studies is not an externally accredited program, students will not be qualified to teach.

(4) To qualify for the award Bachelor of Education Studies a student shall be enrolled in one of the degree programs listed in Clause 1 and pass a program of study approved by the Program and Course Approval Committee on behalf of Academic Senate totalling a minimum of 240 units.

Section 3 - Grading of Degree

(5) The Bachelor of Education Studies will be conferred as an ordinary degree; or

(6) The degree will be awarded 'with Distinction' to those students who gain a minimum GPA of 6.0 based on all studies undertaken in the program.

Section 4 - Re-Admission and/or Re-Enrolment into Original Program

(7) Students awarded the Bachelor of Education Studies will not be permitted to then re-enrol in their original program of study.

(8) Students awarded the Bachelor of Education Studies will not be permitted to enrol in an initial teacher education program at the University of Newcastle.

Section 5 - Right of Appeal

(9) Students may appeal any determination made under Clause 7 to the Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Academic) within 10 working days of being advised of the outcome of their application.

Glossary Terms and Definitions

"Academic Senate" - The Academic Senate of the University as described in the University of Newcastle Act 1989.

"Working day" - Any day other than Saturday, Sunday, or a public holiday in Newcastle, on which business may be conducted.

"Award" - When referring to a University qualification, this term means an academic qualification approved by Academic Senate that is conferred when a student has met the relevant program requirements. For all other uses of this term, the generic definition applies.

"Student" - A person formally enrolled in a course or active in a program offered by the University or affiliated entity.

"Exit award" - An academic qualification that is conferred when a student has met the program requirements of a linked program within the same field of study as listed in the relevant Awards and Programs Schedule.

"GPA" - The Grade Point Average calculated over a set of courses or specified number of courses at a particular level as per the Grade Point Average (GPA) Calculation Guideline.

"Program" - When referring to learning, a program is a sequence of approved learning, usually leading to an Award. For all other uses of this term, the generic definition applies.
